Day 1.

WELCOME TO ARGENTINA!!

Our tour begins with a private transfer from airport to your hotel. We will check in at your hotel located at Recoleta neighborhood. We will have a quick briefing about the adventure ahead.



Day 2. (B – L – D) Buenos Aires...

Day starts early!! We will pick you up and go for a comprehensive city tour, including Plaza de Mayo (May Square), surrounded by the Government House (Casa Rosada), the Metropolitan Cathedral, and the Cabildo (City Hall from the colonial period). The tour continues to the traditional San Telmo district, and the picturesque, italian La Boca neighbourhood where a stop will be made. The tour continues through recently recycled Puerto Madero to Palermo Gardens, and finally to elegant Recoleta, with its fashionable shops and restaurants. Time to get back to hotel and rest for a couple of hours. Early in the evening we will pick you up to go for an delicious dinner followed by an excellent Tango and Folklore Show.

Day 3. (B – L) Ranch farm



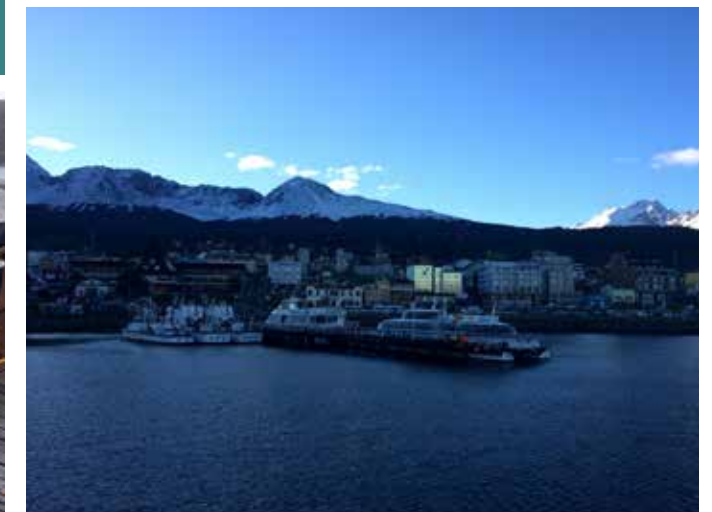
Today we travel to a ranch outside Buenos Aires. On arrival you will be offered "empanadas" (small, very tasty meat pies). At lunch time, a traditional "asado" (barbecue) will be served, including argentine wine. A Folkloric show with native music and dances follows, as well as an exhibition of riding skills of the argentine gaucho. Return to Buenos Aires late afternoon. Check in hotel.



Day 4. (B)

Buenos Aires – Ushuaia (3 hour flight)

Transfer to Aeroparque airport in Buenos Aires to catch our flight to Ushuaia. Arrive to Ushuaia, transfer to our hotel and afternoon visit to the Tierra del Fuego National Park. Departure by National Route Nr 3 in south-west direction, skirting Beagle Channel. We will stop at the old End of the World Railway Station for those who want to make this trip, on a narrow path train, going through the valleys for about 20 minutes. (Access to the train is just wide enough for a regular manual wheelchair. Clients will transfer manually to regular seat, while inside the train). Then, once in the National Park, we will go on to Ensenada Bay, here Redonda Island can be seen. We will go across woods where we will observe the local flora and fauna, till we arrive at Lapataia Bay, the southernmost point of the continent. Return to Ushuaia.





Day 5 (B – L)

Ushuaia city tour + Beagle Navigation

Prepare today to discover this cute town. We will visit the **Ushuaia Navy Base** where is located the old prison closed in 1947, the end of the world museum, Saint Christopher tugboat, the parish “Our Lady of Mercy”, the Monument to the fallen in Malvinas war. Lunch will be served in a local restaurant. For the afternoon we will head towards the tourist pier to sail Beagle Channel, observing Argentinian coasts and Navarino Island on the opposite side (Chile). We will arrive at Les Eclaireurs Headlight, Ushuaia's emblem. Arrival back to Ushuaia. (access to boat is done with ramps, which are approx 75 cm wide).

Day 6 (B)

Ushuaia – El Calafate flight (1 hour)

Today we fly to El Calafate. Once arrive to El Calafate our guide and transportation will be waiting for us. We will then drive for approx 25 minutes to the town El Calafate and check in at our hotel. We will have some time on our own to settled in and then go for a quick walk around and dinner.

Day 7 (B-L)

El Calafate (glaciers)

We start early!! Transfer from El Calafate to Port of Punta Bandera (45 km away). We will board a catamarán (access to boat via ramp), where we will sail across Argentino lake, until we reach the Upsala glacier, which presents many icebergs as we get closer to it. Then we will continue until we reach Spegazzini Glaciär, which descends from the mountains to the lake, which is a perfect frame for a great picture.



We will have a box lunch on the catamarán and return to Puerto Bandera, where we will take our vehicle and drive towards the Perito Moreno glacier. Perito Moreno is an impressive natural wonder. It has more than 200 foot (60 meters) height of ice walls, which are so close to you than you can actually feel you are touching it. Access to look out points is all accessible. Return to El Calafate for dinner.



Day 8 (B-L)

El Calafate-Bariloche

After lunch at our hotel, we will head towards the airport to catch our flight to Bariloche. We may have to take the connection through Buenos Aires or no, depending on availability of flights.

Day 9 (B)

Bariloche (route of 7 lakes)

Drive north out of Bariloche along Route 237, following the shoreline of Lake Nahuel Huapi to Villa La Angostura. Then drive on through forests along the “**Ruta de los Siete Lagos**” (Seven Lakes Route), past Lakes Espejo, Correntoso, Escondido, Villarino, Falkner and Machónico, to Lake Lácar and the town of San Martín de los Andes standing on its shore. Return to Bariloche





Day 10 (B) Bariloche (Big Circuit)

This is a long route, but well worth it to experience. You will travel at National route 237. Along different locations you will visit are Valle Encantado, where you can see strange rock figures, then continue to the cute small Villa Traful, which is on the banks of lake Traful. Finally we will drive to Villa La Angostura, skirting Lake Correntoso. As we keep on traveling we will get back again to National Route N°237, taking us back to San Carlos de Bariloche.

Day 11 (B) Bariloche-Iguazú

Today we catch our flight to Iguazu. We will have a stop at Buenos Aires airport, where we will connect with our flight to Iguazu. Arrive to Iguazu late afternoon – early evening. Transfer in to the hotel.

Day 12 (B) Iguazu falls

Transfer from the hotel to the entrance of the National Park. The tour continues with the “Upper Circuit”, which offers magnificent panoramic views of the Falls. (1 hour panoramic views) and then to the ecological train which will take us now to the famous Garganta del Diablo “Devils Throat”, (2 hours time, walk around catwalks for approx 1200 meters) which certainly is the highlight of this tour.



Day 13 (B) Iguazu

After such a long holiday, we will have a day off to recover, rest, enjoy the hotel facilities and simply wander around. Day at your own.

Day 14 (B- L) Iguazú-Buenos Aires

Connecting flight to Buenos Aires in order to connect to your international flight. If time permitting, we will have a quick visit to Evita Peron museum, in Buenos Aires where we will have lunch. We will provide transportation to connect between airports in Buenos Aires. End of services.

About the tour:

ARGENTINA program is a tour that combines a bit of adventure, culture, nature, and leisure.

- It is an all-inclusive basis tour. Transportation, accommodation, guide, and activities included. (Some meal as well according to program)

- Hotels throughout the ARGENTINA program present a good level of accessibility. Some have roll in showers, some have small (5 inches) step to get into showers, grab on bars, but in general they adapt their facilities to host people using a wheelchair.

- Re: boat rides on the Beagle channel as well as Argentino lake we manually assist the guest by moving or lifting wheelchair to enter the boat.

- SAFA is able to provide a van and/or a bus with portable ramp

- Individual or assisted manual transfer into seats is required.

- SAFA provides bilingual certified guides for all activities throughout the tour.

- Re: assistants or help; we recommend clients use a manual chair, since the entire country is not 100% accessible. Therefore, we will provide one assistant per client to assist with the wheelchair when needed. This will only be for tours and activities, NOT personal activities or duties.

About the client:

- Client must be able to do individual or assisted manual transfers into bus seats, shower chairs, boats, etc.

- Willing to share transportation and activities with others while in the boat rides (if necessary).
